

## LAW INFORMATION

The following states have passed the Lemonade Stand Law allowing children to sell lemonade without securing a health permit. This can be on public property like parks, sidewalks, and playgrounds, or on private property with the permission of the owner.

- California

For other states, please visit your local city government website to secure a low-cost permit to set up your student(s) and/or child's stand.

Put together a list of the business owners your student(s) wants to visit (or call) to ask them for permission to set up their stand outside of their business. Typically, businesses are excited to support young entrepreneurs by providing stand locations. The sooner your student/child can confirm their location, the better!
